2022-23 mid-season review *Round-up of Sussex rugby action*

From U12s who are enjoying Sussex action for the first time to the more experienced Colts, no squad has been immune to travel and weather disruption during the first half of the season. Colts even had to contend with an enforced 2-night stay in the UK after BA cancelled their flight home at short notice.

The Colts, comprising mainly 16/17 year-olds, have a respectable 2 wins from 6 in the Premier Division, as well as a thumping 58-0 win over Uckfield in the Cup, which sets up a tantalising quarter final clash with Brighton. U16s are second in League 2 behind the seemingly unstoppable Brighton, whilst U15s are unbeaten in League 3, although weather disruptions mean only 3 rounds have been completed so there is still everything to play for.

In the Sussex Waterfall tournaments, U14s have won 3 out of 4 on the road, losing only to Guernsey. Their desire to reverse the earlier defeat last weekend fell foul of the weather, as frozen pitches at St Peter made contact impossible and the teams played Touch instead.

U13s are a large squad and have 2 teams entered in the Waterfall, an organisational feat in itself and testament to the dedication of the

group's Coaches and Manager. Both teams combined their Sussex games with a trip to Twickenham in November, where the England victory clearly inspired U13 Red team (right) who went on to beat a strong Lewes side 25-10.


